Harrisville bank closes while closed market temporarily reopens

This past week marked the last time that First National Bank operated in Harrisville.

The bank signs were removed by 2:30 p.m. Friday and business ceased at the Harrisville branch. The good news is that FNB's Grove City location remains open.

While the residents are sad to see their hometown bank leave, it opens the way for a new bank to take residence.

The landmark wooden building will be torn down to make way for new construction.

Right down the road at the former Taylor's Market and Rosemary Lane, Mercer County State bank will open.

Due to a non-compete clause, the Harrisville site will remain empty until someone buys the property for something other than a bank.


